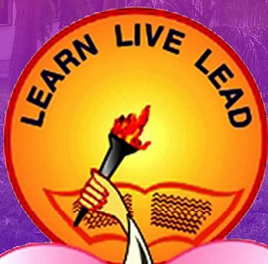

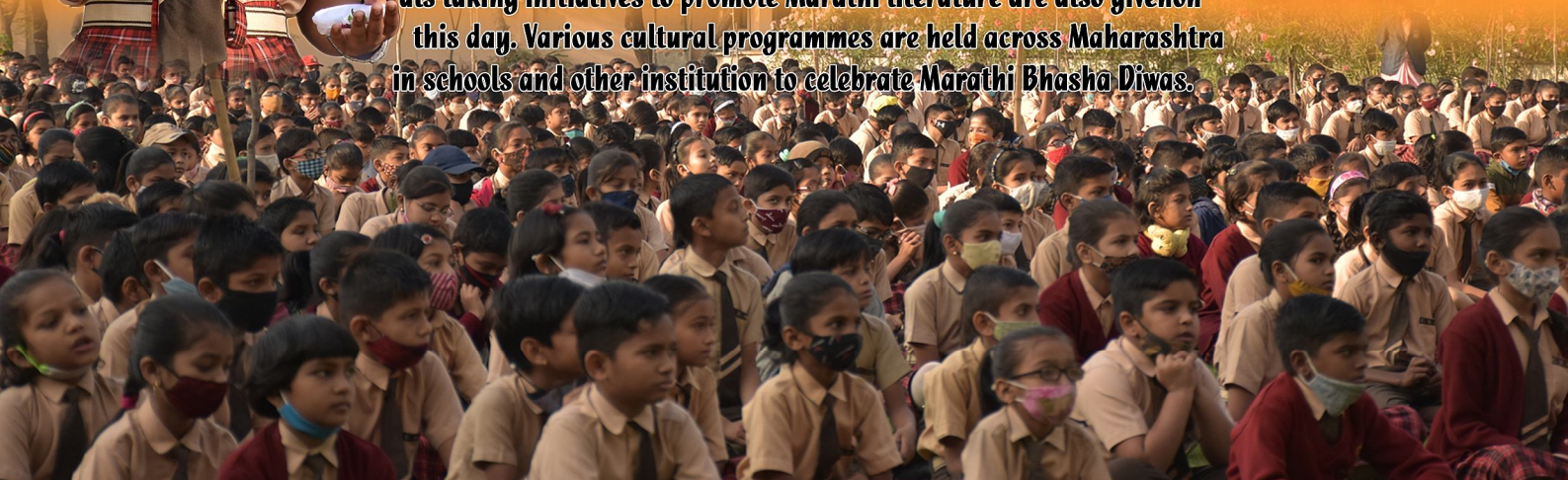
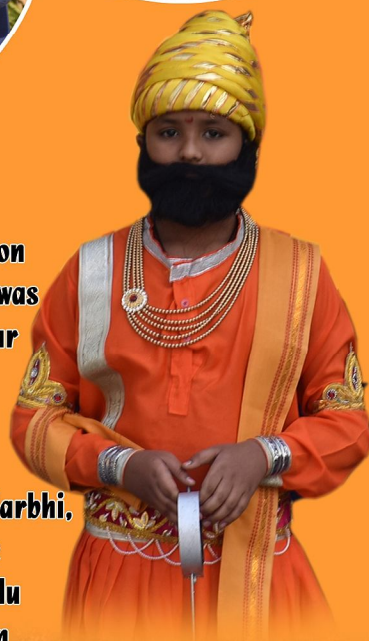
FEAST DAY CELEBRATION

Marathi Bhasha Divas or Marathi Day is celebrated on February 27 every year on the birth anniversary of eminent Marathi poet Vishnu Vaman Shirwadkar, who was popularly known as 'Kusumagraj'. The day is celebrated to recognise and honour the greatness of Marathi literature. Marathi language "contains some of the oldest literature of all modern Indo-European languages.. A dating from about 900 AD. Marathi is one of the most spoken languages in India with 42 dialects, out of which some of the most common ones are Vaidarbhi, Zadi Boli, Kokani and Khandishi. The syntax of the language and the grammar come from Prakrit and Pali. Two special awards for individuals taking initiatives to promote Marathi literature are also given on this day. Various cultural programmes are held across Maharashtra in schools and other institutions to celebrate Marathi Bhasha Divas.
